- **Will it build goodwill and better friendships?**
- **Will it be beneficial to all concerned?**

# *2021 Four-Way Test Competition*

## *Simple Steps for Student Participation*

1. Create a poster drawing or PowerPoint that addresses all four elements of the Four-Way Test. Students should work independently but if they don't mind splitting the prize money, up to 2 may collaborate on a project. You will need a half-piece of poster board paper (14" x 22"). Students may use markers, crayons, colored pencils, paint, glitter or any other conventional or unconventional art supply (cut and paste magazine pictures, computer generated pictures and words, pictures from coloring books, newspapers, wallpaper, foam cut-outs or recycled art projects, etc.) as long as they communicate the core values of the Four-Way Test. Be creative and have fun!
2. Take a .jpg format or phone picture of the poster (must be legible) or save the .ppt file, and email to your teacher.
3. Your teacher will email all submissions **by grade** to the assigned Rotary Club judge **no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, March 12, 2021**. Use "[Name] Elementary School Rotary FWT Submission" in the subject line. Include the student name(s) with correct spelling, school, grade, and homeroom teacher's name in the body of the email.
4. The Rotary Club of Hunt Valley will judge entries based on the following criteria:
  - All four questions must be included
  - How the four questions of the Four-Way Test are addressed
  - A slogan or title must be used to tie the concept together
  - Quality designs that include neat, bright and colorful illustrations
5. Winning entries will be announced at an awards program on **Wednesday, April 14, 2021** (details TBD and shared at a later date). Students will receive a certificate and cash prizes: First Place \$40, Second Place \$30, Third Place \$20.

The Four-Way Test of the things we think, say or do is used by Rotarians worldwide as a moral guide for both business and personal relationships, and ethical decision-making. Developed by Herbert J. Taylor in the 1930's, it has stood the test of time. Especially given current national turmoil, we firmly believe that "character counts" and that children closely observe and follow the behaviors of adult role models in their lives.

Most recently, our club partnered with Captain Rick Rubel, Distinguished Military Professor of Ethics at the U.S. Naval Academy to develop a program, "Character Development and the Rotary Four-Way Test." Please visit our website to watch this enlightening 30 minute video recording.

Rotary is an all-volunteer service organization with nearly 1.2 million members worldwide. Houck Foundation, with community sponsorship support, funds the Four-Way Test program and Operation Warm (due to the pandemic, a record 277 new winter coats were delivered to children in need this year).
