**Paul's Talk:** Paul is from Minnesota and entered the Air Force in 2000. He did 11 years active duty, primarily flying A-10s, and has been a resident of Monkton for the past ten years. Paul has 2 daughters at Sparks ES and Hereford MS and flies with Delta Airlines out of NY. Lt. Col. Kanning is currently doing a year of professional military education at the **United States Army War College** in Carlisle, PA. As part of his Army War College curriculum, he was asked to do a speaking engagement with local civic organizations, and we are his grateful audience. The **175th Wing (175 WG)** is a unit of the **Maryland Air National Guard** stationed at Warfield Air National Guard Base, Middle River. If activated to federal service, components of the Wing are gained by the two separate major commands of the United States Air Force: Air Combat Command (ACC) and United States Air Forces in Europe (USAFE). The 104th Fighter Squadron, assigned to the wing's 175th Operations Group, is a descendant organization of the 104th Observation Squadron, established on 29 June 1921. It is one of the 29 original National Guard Observation Squadrons of the United States Army National Guard formed before World War II. It is the oldest unit in the **Maryland Air National Guard** and is celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of service to the state and nation this year. The 175th Wing is a composite unit and has three active USAF gaining commands: the Air Combat Command for its fighter aircraft and cyber units, and United States Air Forces in Europe for its 235th Civil Engineer Flight. The wing comprises two operations groups: The 175th Operations Group is the wing's flying unit, and includes a fighter squadron and an operations support squadron. The 175th Cyberspace Operations Group is the wing's cyber unit, and includes three subordinate cyberspace operations squadrons and an operations support squadron. The wing also includes support units, including security forces, engineers, communications, logistics, and administrative support functions. Approximately 1,500 full-time and traditional part-time members of the **Maryland Air National Guard** are assigned to the 175th Wing. The **Maryland Air National Guard** has played a part in election security and COVID vaccination distribution and was called in to defend the Capitol on Jan. 6. It was a pleasure to meet you, Lt. Col. Kanning, and we will watch for a special 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration at **Martin State Airport** later this year. ☺
